## Re: Your Freedom of Information Request dated 23 June 2022. Our Reference FOI 8992

I write further to your recent request for information which the Education Authority received on 23 June 2022 for information relating to:

I would be grateful if you could supply me with statistics for the number of Polish speaking children in schools in Northern ireland, listed, if possible, with a breakdown in counties or education authorities, as recorded in January 2017.

Please see our response below:

Northern Ireland is a single education authority and we do not hold disaggregated data by country. Polish is the largest of the minority languages in schools in Northern Ireland. The latest school census in October 2017 recorded the following:

- 6,671 pupils have Polish recorded as their native language
- 4,544 pupils are in primary school
- 2,041 pupils are post-primary school
- 86 pupils are placed in special schools
